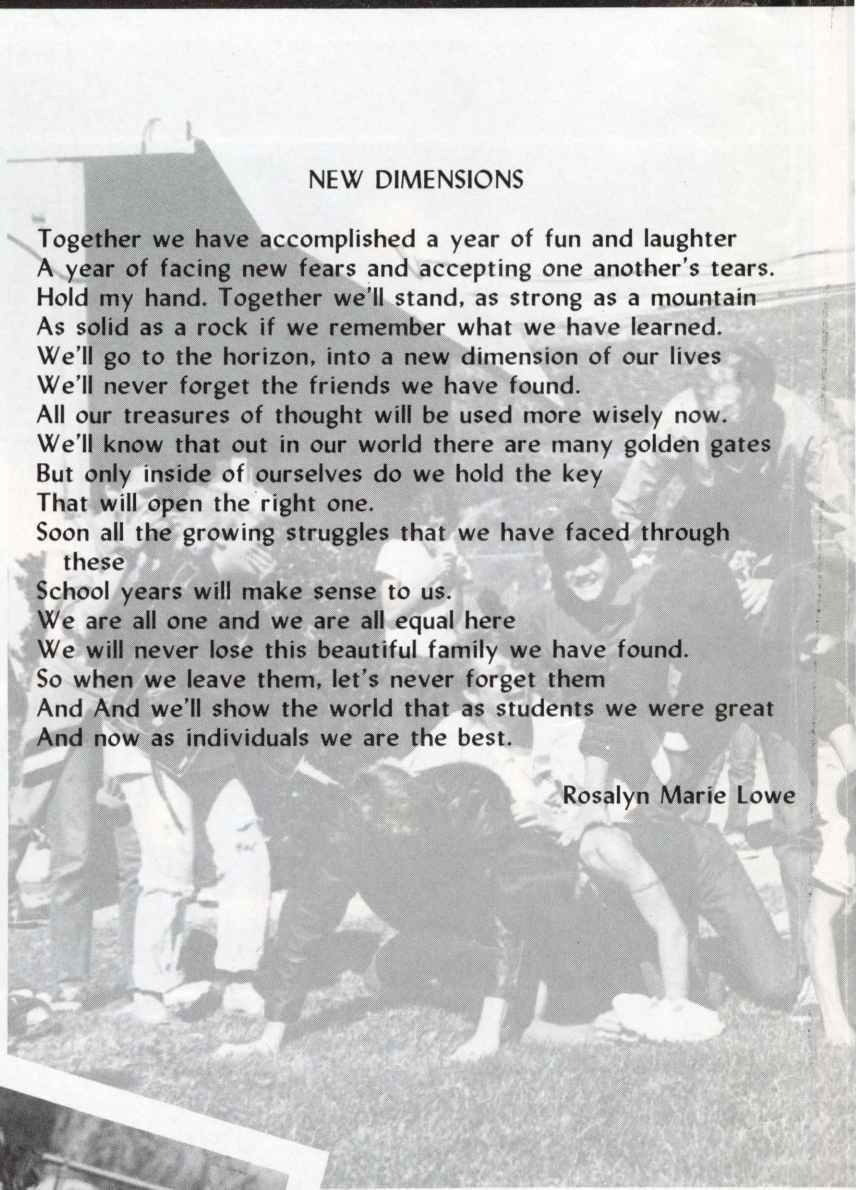

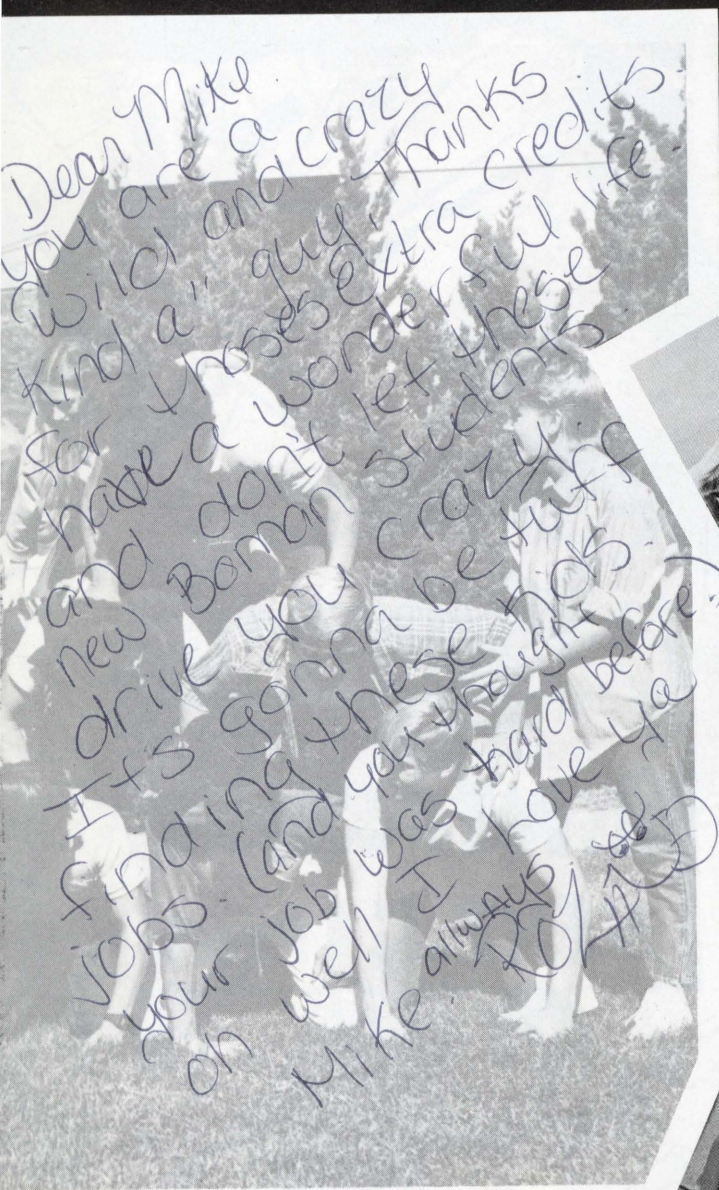


NEW DIMENSIONS

Fourth period Reading won a pizza party by bringing almost 500 cans of food for December's canned food drive.



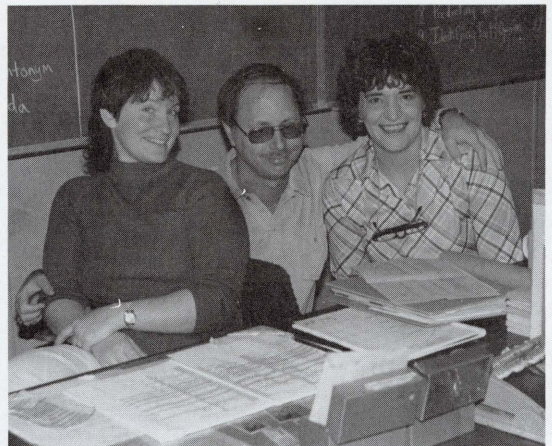

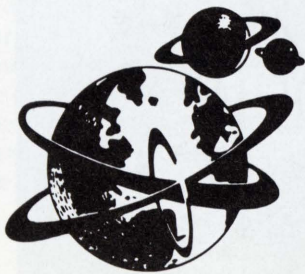
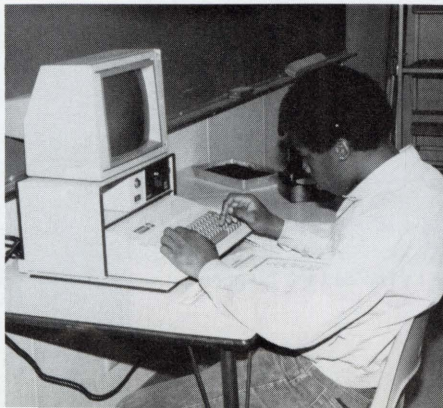
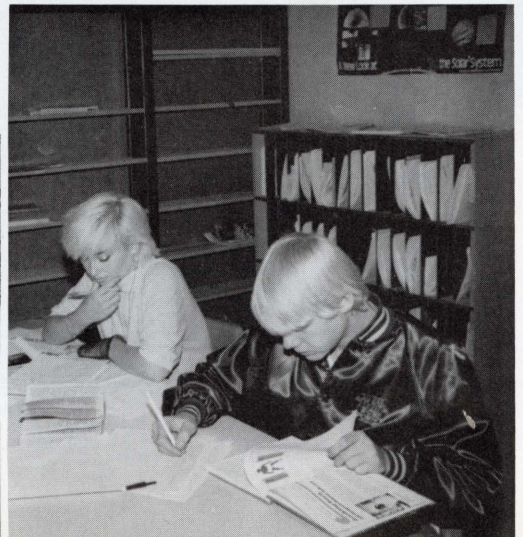
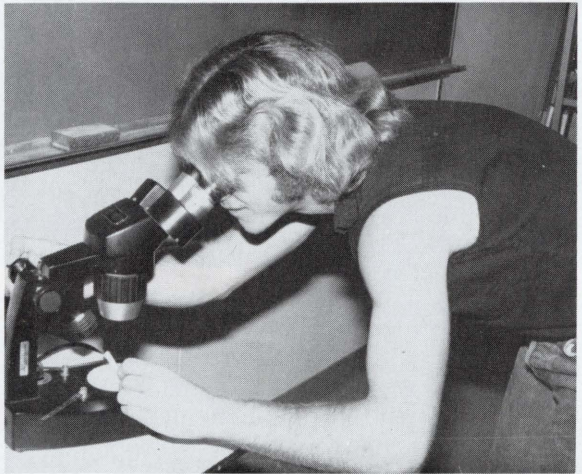
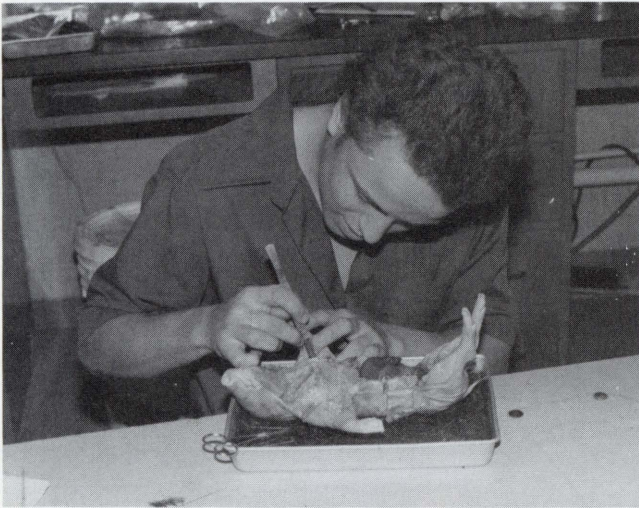
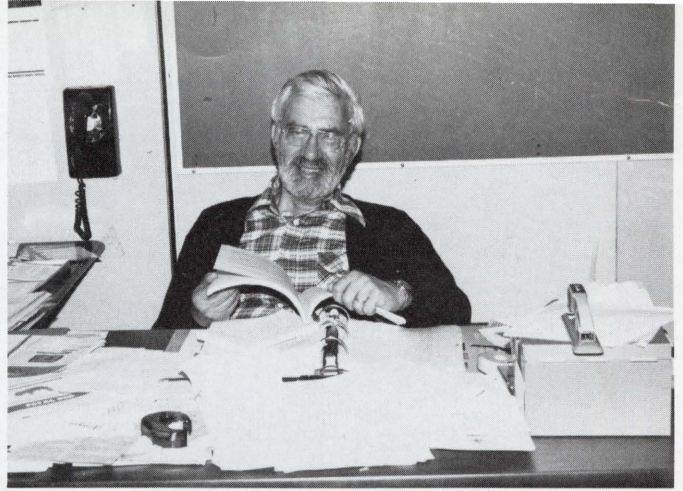
ART
