
"Walk together, talk together, all ye people of the world. Then, and only then can ye have peace." These are the aims of the American Field Service Foreign Exchange Student Program.





HOMECOMING FLOATS


Coach Hansen Due to inexperience, the J.V. football team had a hard season. They showed the unwavering determination typical of Hart's Indians all through the season.
