


"SEMI-TOUGH"




















SOPHOMORE



















"MARATHON MAN"







"FAST BREAK"















JUNIOR VARSITY


THE BABE RUTH STORY






TUMBLE WEEDS









FOUL PLAY




THE SOUND OF MUSIC

















ROAD TO RIO


















THE STING




MY FAIR LADY
















WHO'S KILLING THE GREAT CHEFS OF EUROPE






LOVE STORY
